We ended our season theme with rain dance and the children had a wonderful time dancing in the rain.

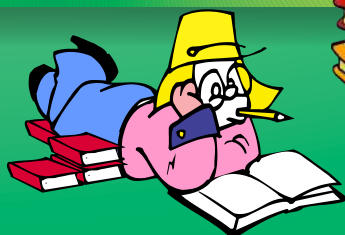
Celebrations
