


# NEWS LETTER

Introduction to all the Capital letters.  
Introduction to numbers – 15 to 20 with their quantities.

Butterfly (L3)

Reinforcement of 3 letter words containing the short vowel 'e', 'i' and 'o'.  
Reinforcement of concepts – Rhyming words, Singular Plural.  
Introduction of the concept 'Opposites'.  
Reinforcement of numbers from 50 – 100 with quantities.  
Introduction to three sets of sight words (at, he, or, she, my, so, us, of, put, was) (do, who, any, him, are, day, out, see, way, you) (use, new, old, how, why, now, from, said, with & will)  
Working with Montessori materials.

**PLANTS:** We spoke to the children about the importance of plants in the environment, how to grow and take care of them. We did the different parts of the plant and spoke about the functions of each part. We also spoke about different kinds of flowers, fruits and vegetables.

- ☺ Children made Parts of the plant with hand prints; they also made beautiful flowers using crepe paper.
- ☺ Sprouts delight - We sprouted green gram and mixed some vegetables and enjoyed a healthy sprout salad.
- ☺ Children brought fruits to make 'Fruit Salad'




## Rhymes of the months
